

Curriculum vitae Stefano Aiolli

Stefano Aiolli was born in Florence in 1991.

At twelve years old he starts private cello's lessons under the supervision of prof. Elisabetta Sciotti. In February 2013 he graduates at the Florence Conservatory "L.Cherubini" under M° Andrea Nannoni with full marks.

He carries on his studies with M° Giovanni Sollima at the Accademia Romanini in Brescia and studies Baroque music with prof. Bettina Hoffman in Scuola di Musica di Fiesole.

In the mean time he also takes master courses under Master Thomas de Menga and Rocco Fillippini.

He was part of the string quartet "Kreutzer" with whom he participates in various concerts.

Afterwards with the string trio "Solaris" he played in Italy and France, in the latter for the "Musique en Morvan" festival.

Also with "Trio Solaris" he followed the chamber music course kept by Master Sergey Girshenko (Teacher at Moscow Conservatory and last pupil of the famous cellist David Oistrak), Massimo Polidori (first cellist of the Scala Theatre of Milan), Ettore Causa (teacher at Yale University), Gaetano Adorno (master quartet at Catania Conservatory), Claudio Voghera (pianist of the "Johannes Trio"), Rocco Filippini, Claire Cornelup (conservatory of Paris), Pierre Cao (music director), Antonello Farulli (viola Master at Conservatory of Bologna), and with the Quartet of Turin.

With the "Trio Cherubini" he also did a small tournée around Spain.

In 2012 he won the competition to be part of the NJO (Youth Orchestra of the Netherlands).

Stefano is also part of the Shanghai International Youth Orchestra.

At the moment he is first cellist of the Italian Youth Orchestra and World Youth Orchestra.

Further on he is also working as composer and orchestral conductor.
